## Dr. Paul Boshears to be installed as Atlanta Chapter President



## Atlanta Chapter Patriot Graves receive new US Flags

Each year during the last week in June, in preparation for Fourth of July celebrations, the Atlanta Chapter Sons of the American Revolution Graves Committee places new US National Flags on all accessible known Patriot Graves in our area of responsibility within the Metro Atlanta Region.

This year, the Graves Committee visited 8 Metro Atlanta Cemeteries containing 16 Patriot Graves and one Veteran of the War of 1812.

We additionally placed 4 flags on Atlanta Chapter Compatriot graves located in the Historic Decatur Cemetery and one flag on the grave of Ann Parks Kirkpatrick, daughter of Revolutionary War Soldier Hugh Park.

#### Schedule of Events:

- 1. 9:30 AM 12:00 PM. We will host a combined meeting of the Georgia and South Carolina C.A.R. in the Kroc Center Auditorium.
- 2. 12:00 PM 1:00 PM. The local SAR chapters with assistance from the Augusta Chapter, NSDAR, will host a luncheon consisting of BBQ sandwiches, potato salad, and tea provided by Larry Sconyers BBQ in the Kroc Center Lunchroom. There will also be dessert. You must sign up for the luncheon in advance and the cost is \$16.00 per person.
- 3. 1:00 PM 1:45 PM. We will conduct the commemoration ceremony in the comfortable 300-seat Kroc Center Auditorium. The ceremony will consist of bringing greetings, a battle seminar by Historian Steven Rauch and wreath presentations.

1. Following the indoor ceremony, we will go out to the battlefield behind the Kroc Center to watch a mock battle reenactment demonstration to be conducted by our militia and artillery sections firing black powder muskets and six black powder cannons.

## **Veterans Respect Activities**

Our chapter began a project in early 2019 to purchase VA Canteen Coupon Books which patients can use in the canteen, coffee shop or cafeteria at the VAH, Decatur. These books will be distributed by the VA Volunteer Service at the hospital. At each meeting there will be a jar marked "\$ for VA Canteen Coupon Books" to accept donations. Please look for it and contribute a dollar (or more).

The role of the Veterans Respect Committee is to pursue opportunities to honor and recognize current service members and veterans of past service. A wide range of activities fall under this charge. Some examples are:

- -hours served in the VA Hospital (VAH) Volunteer Service,
- -visiting a veteran in a VAH, nursing home or private home,
- -donating personal care items to a VAH or nursing home serving veterans,
- -donating publications to a VAH,
- -organizing an outing for one or more veterans,
- -participating in a veteran's funeral as a participant, pallbearer, or attendee,
- -attendance at Revolutionary War Veteran's Grave Marking,
- -participating in placing flags or wreaths on veteran's graves.

We are aware that many of our Atlanta Chapter members have been involved in such activities, but we do not know the extent. We would like to gather information on such efforts. If you have been involved in any such activities since January 1, 2024, please report the details to our Chaplain John Titus.
